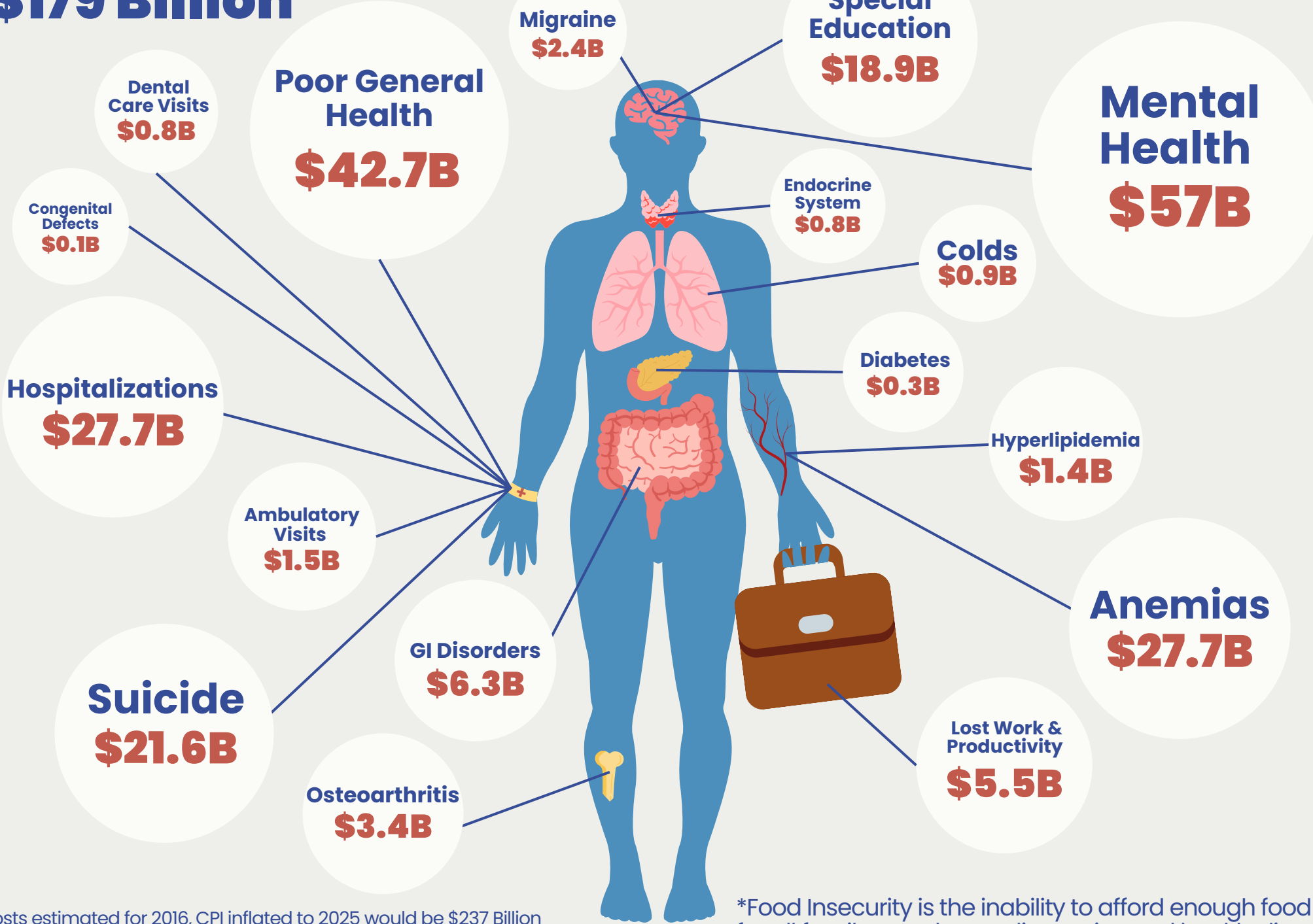


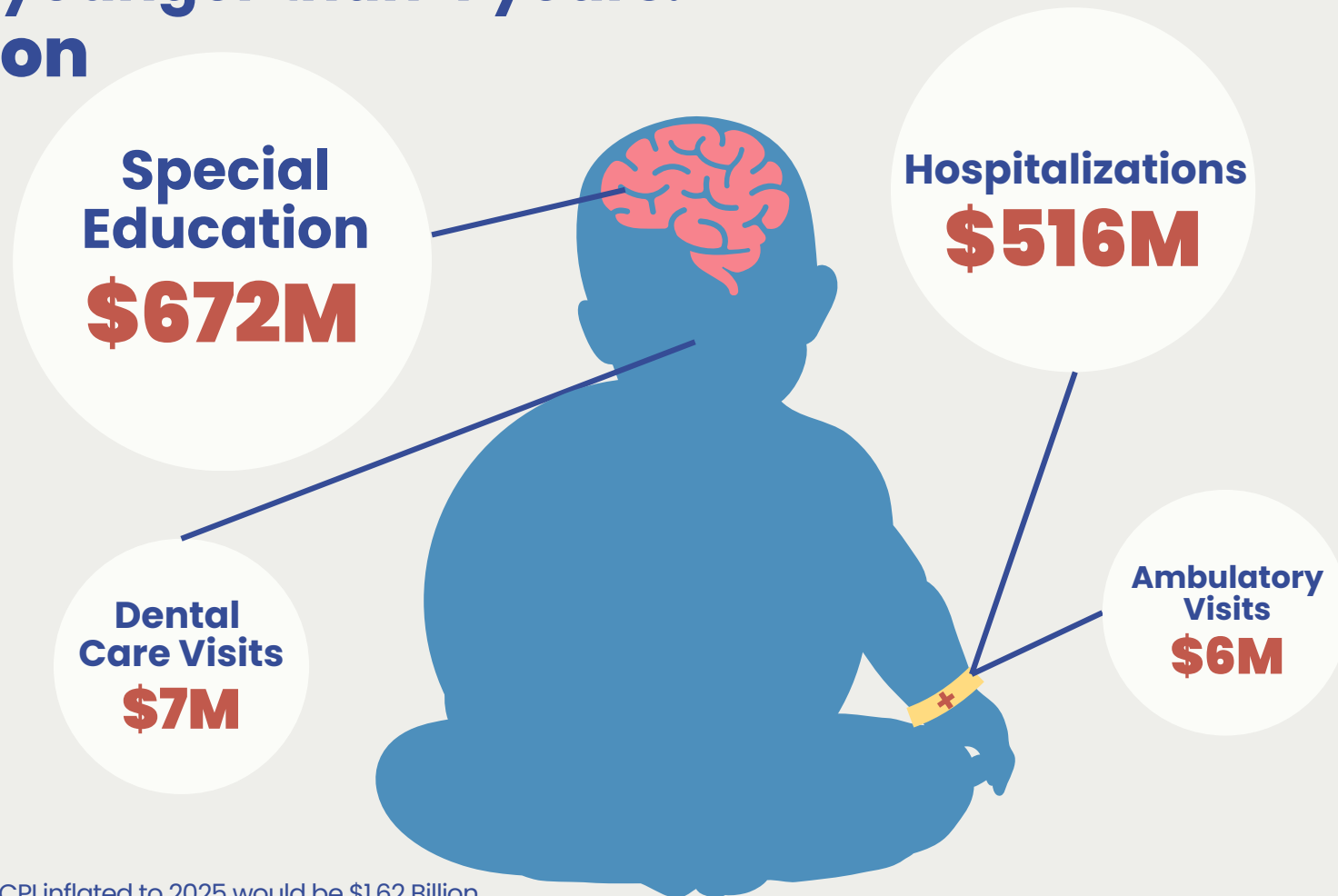
Costs related to food insecurity*: \$179 Billion
